Focus on Compliance

Administrative Penalties

The Board routinely receives questions asking how administrative penalties are calculated. The goal of this article is to help licensees and registrants understand how the Board calculates administrative penalties for anyone who commits a violation of the Acts or Board rules.

To calculate an administrative penalty, Board staff relies on the sanction tables found in Board Rules 139.35 and 139.37, for engineering and surveying violations, respectively. The sanction tables contain baseline penalties for violating specific rules.
